




Instructions for making a male pilgrim puppet















3) Stick your pilgrim onto 1 A6 sheet.



- 2) Take a white paper plate (approx 23cm). Cut part of the edge to make the face and collar.
 - 4) Use the template to cut a black hat from the A5 piece of card. Stick the hat on your pilgrim.
 - 5) Use the template to cut a brown hat band and gold buckle. If you do not have brown or gold card, cut from white card or paper and then colour it in. Stick on your pilgrim's hat.
 - 6) Use pens to add a nose, eyes and mouth.
 - 7) Turn the puppet over and use sticky tape to fix a stick on to the back of your puppet.


NB: The large buckle hat in this design conforms to the current stereotype but is not historically accurate.


This style did not become popular until later in the century.





Instructions and template for making a female pilgrim puppet





1) Take a white paper plate (approx 23cm). Cut out the sections shown.


2) Stick your pilgrim onto 1 A6 black sheet of card.

3) Cut out this shape from white card. Stick to the back of the puppet's head as shown.



4) Use pens to add a nose, eyes and mouth.

5) Turn the puppet over and use sticky tape to fix a stick on to the back of your puppet.



NB: This pilgrim is shown wearing a black dress. Pilgrims wore black for formal occassions but would also wear colours such as blue and even patterns.
