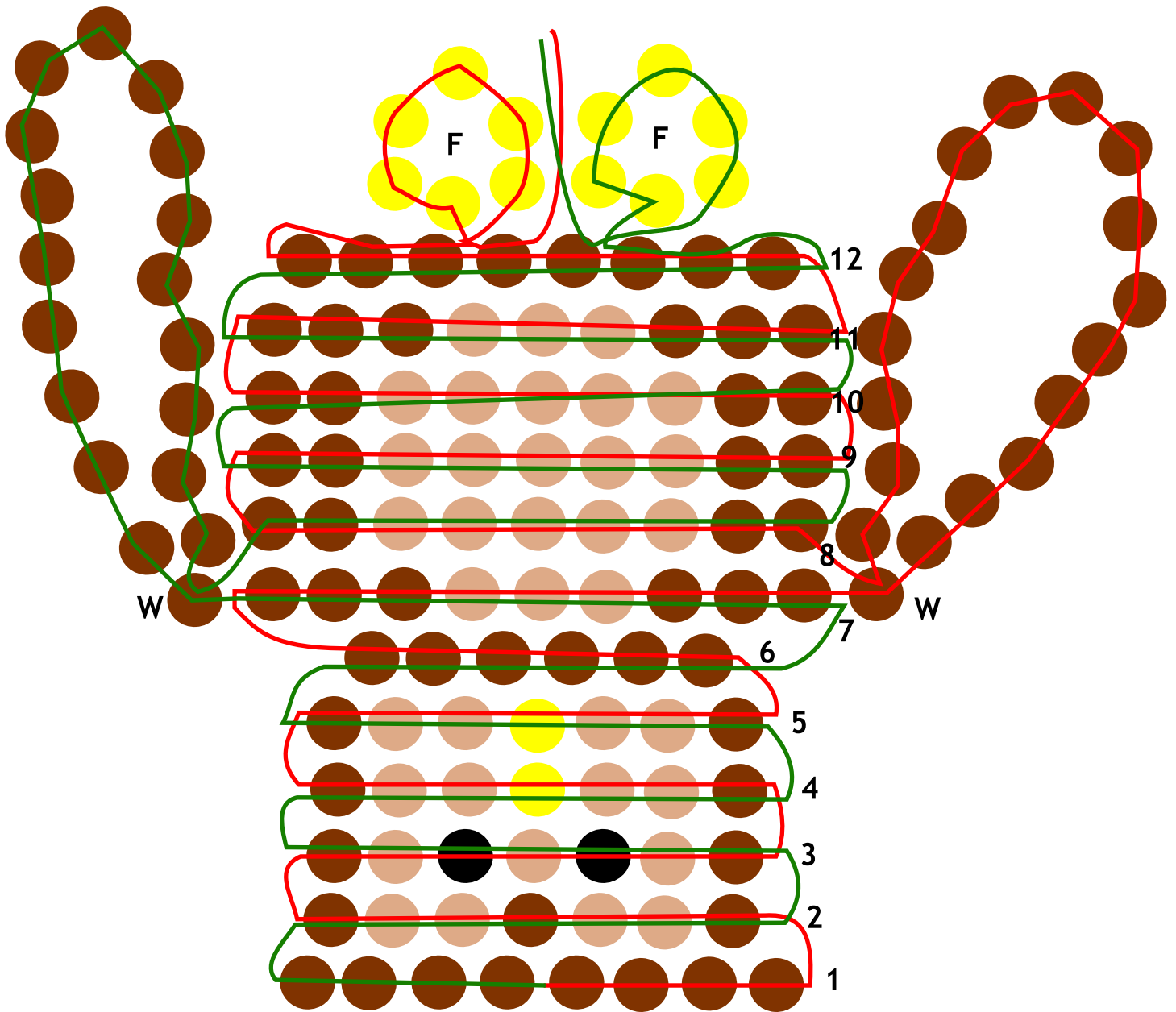


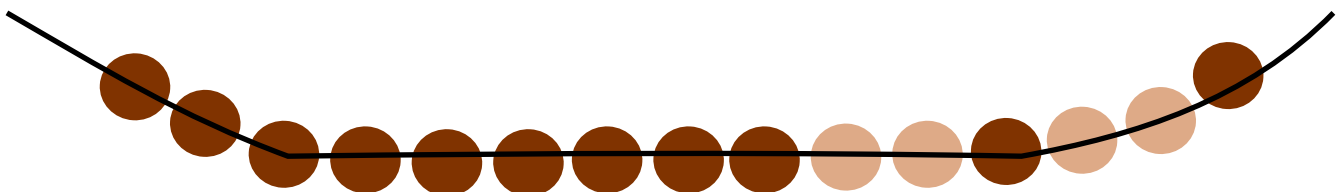
Beaded Owl Instructions



You will need a long, thin piece of wire and 4mm beads with reasonably large holes in the following colours:

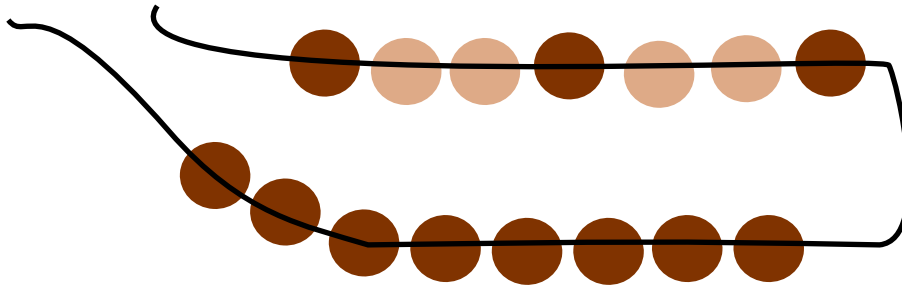


1) Thread 9 brown beads, 2 cream beads, 1 brown bead, 2 cream beads and 1 brown bead onto the centre of your wire.

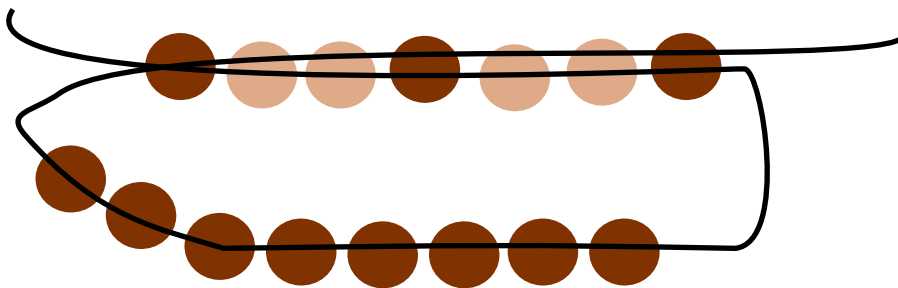


NB: Step 2-4 are the hardest part. When you've worked it out, the rest is easy!

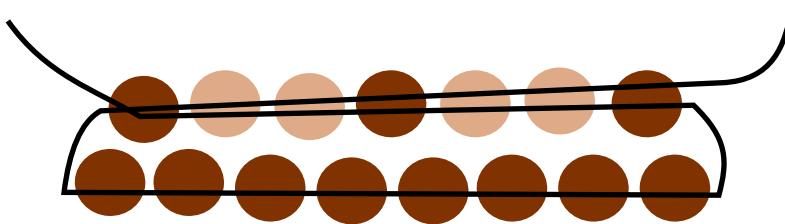
2) Arrange your beads like so:



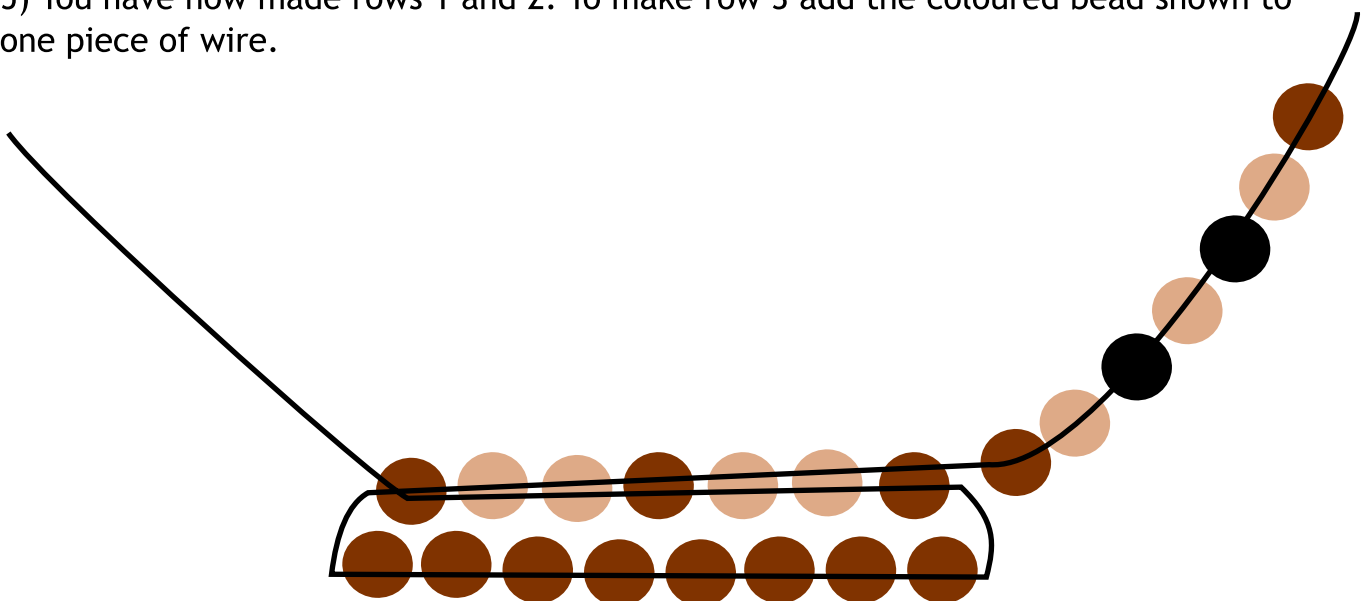
3) Take the left wire end and thread it back through the beads on the 2nd "row".



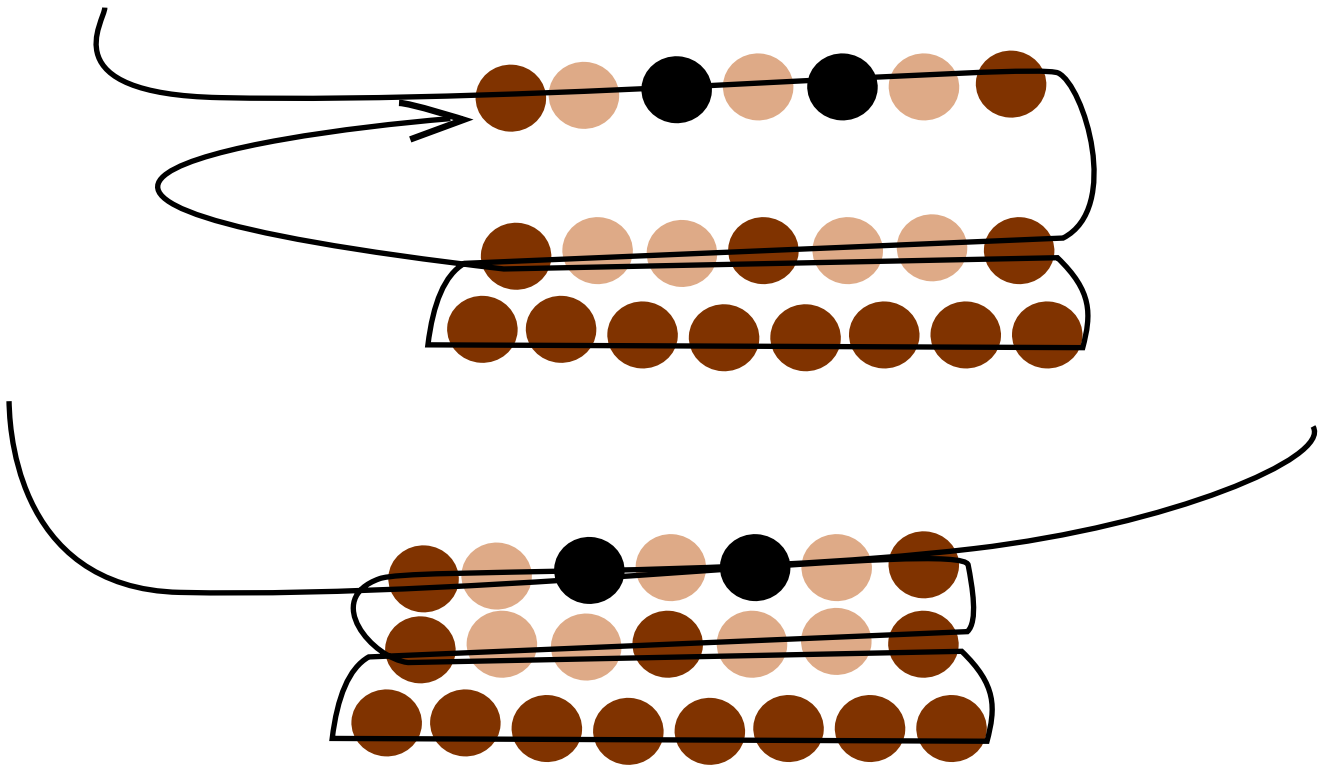
4) Pull both loose ends so that your first two rows come tight together.



5) You have now made rows 1 and 2. To make row 3 add the coloured bead shown to one piece of wire.

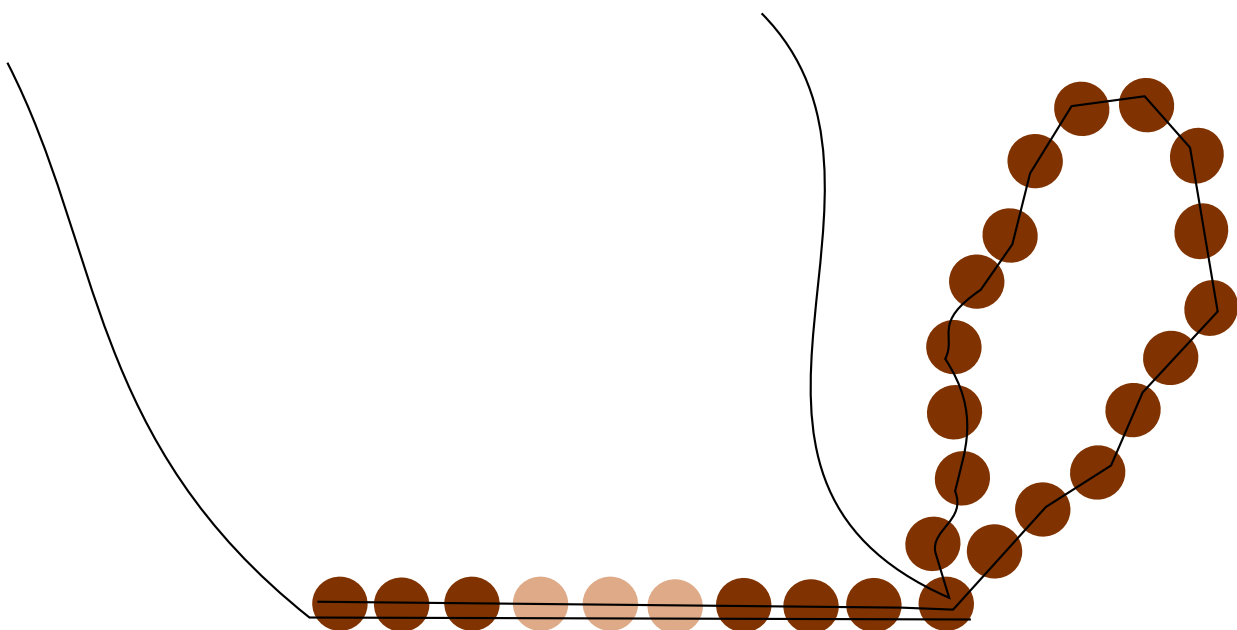


6) Take the wire you did not thread the beads onto and back thread. Then pull tight.



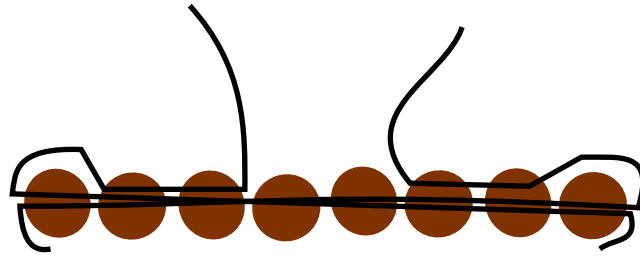
7) Rows 4, 5, 6 and 7 are made in the same way as row 3. Refer to the diagram on the front page to see which colours to add.

8) The wings are added after row 7 has been threaded. Thread 18 brown beads onto one of the pieces of wire. After bead 18, thread through bead 1 again. Pull up tight and then repeat on the other piece of wire.

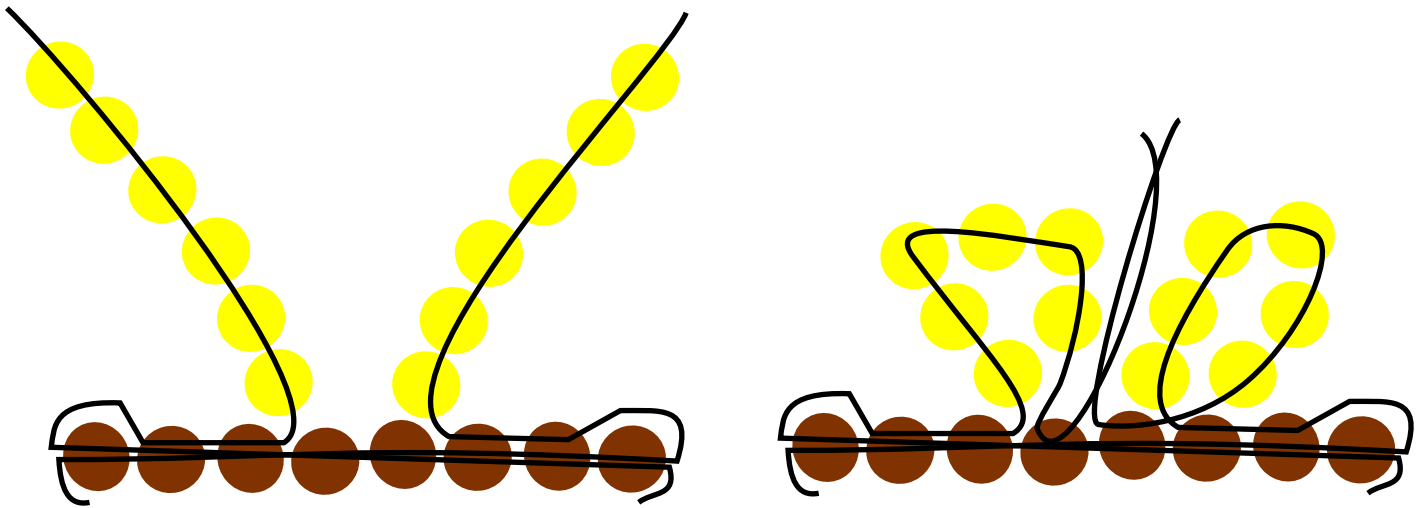


9) Rows 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 are made using the same threading technique as rows 3-7.

10) After row 12, thread over the end bead and back through the next two beads.



11) To make each foot thread 6 yellow beads and then thread through the next brown bead. Make sure the wire is pulled tight.



12) Twist the two ends of wire together. You can either wrap them around the centre of row 12 and then cut the excess wire or weave them around the centre of several rows. The second option is useful to help close unwanted gaps (these occur if you have not pulled the wire enough after each row).

13) To complete your owl, twist the wings and shape them. Bend the top of the owls head.

14) Optional: Add a keyring chain to the top of your owl.
